# A RESOLUTION OF PENN TOWNSHIP, ST. JOSEPH COUNTY, INDIANA AUTHORIZING THE INTERLOCAL AGREMENT FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF AN ENTRANCE ROADWAY FOR THE PENN TOWNSHIP FIRE STATION NO. 13 PROJECT – CANDACE LANE WITH THE ST. JOSEPH COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

WHEREAS, the Board of Penn Civil Township, St. Joseph County, Indiana met at a duly called and authorized meeting of the Board of Penn Township on the date set forth below, such meeting having been called pursuant to a published notice posted at the Penn Township Trustee's Office more than forty-eight (48) hours in advance of the meeting and which notice stated the time, place and purpose of the meeting and which was received by all Penn Township Board Members; and

WHEREAS, the following resolution was made, seconded and adopted by those present at the meeting; and

WHEREAS, in its Resolution R-C-20-2021, the St. Joseph County Board of Commissioners (the "Commissioners") desire to assist with the Project as the new entrance roadway for the Fire Station is being required by the County as an access point for the Fire Station; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners would provide funding to pay for asphalt paving, earthwork, site utilities and sign relocation, inspections and other associated costs; and

WHEREAS, that pursuant to Indiana Code 36-1-7-1 et seq. the Board of Penn Township is authorized to enter into interlocal agreements and it would be beneficial to the residents of Penn Township and neighboring municipalities to enter into an Interlocal Agreement Related to the Construction of an Entrance Roadway for the Penn Township Fire Station No. 13-Project, commonly referred to by Penn Township as Candace Lane; and

WHEREAS, Penn Township wishes to enter into the Interlocal Agreement Related to the Construction of an Entrance Roadway for the Penn Township Fire Station No. 13 Project, commonly referred to by Penn Township as Candace Lane, with the exception of the use of \$48,000.00, as set forth in Penn Township's Resolution 2021-20, which was earmarked for the relocation of a billboard located on the property where Penn Fire Station No. 13 is located.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Penn Township approves the Interlocal Agreement Related to the Construction of an Entrance Roadway for the Penn Township Fire Station No. 13 Project attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and authorizes the Penn Township Trustee to execute the Interlocal Agreement Related to the Construction of an Entrance Roadway for the Penn Township Fire Station No. 13 Project, commonly referred to by Penn Township as Candace Lane, on behalf of Penn Township and to act on its behalf as set forth in the terms therein and accepts funding in the amount of \$452,000.00.

# INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT RELATED TO THE CONSTRUCTION OF AN ENTRANCE ROADWAY FOR THE PENN TOWNSHIP FIRE STATION NO. 13 PROJECT

This Agreement is made and entered into this \_\_\_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_\_, by and between PENN TOWNSHIP, ST. JOSEPH COUNTY, INDIANA (hereinafter referred to as the "Township") and the BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF ST. JOSEPH, INDIANA (hereinafter referred to as the "County")

### RECITALS

WHEREAS, the County has been in discussions with the Township to assist with costs related to the construction of a new entrance roadway for the new Penn Township Fire Station No.13 (the "Fire Station") and associated site prep work (the "Project") that the Township is building; and

WHEREAS, the Commission desires to assist with the Project as the new entrance roadway for the Fire Station is being required by the County as an access point for the Fire Station; and

WHEREAS, the Commission would provide funding to pay for various improvements as outlined herein below; and

**WHEREAS**, the Township and the County enter into this Agreement to identify the duties and responsibilities of each party regarding the Project.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the following terms, conditions, and commitments, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. <u>Purpose of Agreement</u>: The purpose of this Agreement is to outline the obligations and responsibilities of each of the parties regarding the Project.
- 2. <u>The Project</u>: The Project involves the construction of a new entrance roadway to be used for an access point for the Penn Township First Station No. 13 currently being built by the Township.
- Responsibility of the County: The County shall be responsible for providing funding for certain improvements related to the Project including but not limited to asphalt paving, earthwork, site utilities, utilities and related to the Project including but not limited to asphalt paving, earthwork, site utilities, utilities and related in inspections, and other associated costs (the "Improvements"). The County's monetary contribution to the Project shall not exceed \$500,000.00 (the "County Payment"). The parties recognize and agree that the Project cost exceeds the County Payment and the Township agrees to pay and be responsible for any and all other costs associated with the Project.
- 4. <u>Construction of the Entrance Roadway</u>: The Township shall be responsible for all aspects of the design, construction, and maintenance of the Project. The parties recognize and

agree that the only contribution by the County regarding the Project is the County Payment as outlined in Paragraph 3.

- 5. <u>Term</u>: This Agreement shall be effective upon signing and shall continue until the completion of the Project or until such time as either party provides at least sixty (60) days written notice of termination of this Agreement.
- 6. <u>Limitations of Liability</u>: The Township agrees to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the County and its agents, officers, and employees from all claims and suits of any nature whatsoever arising from the Township's performance of this Agreement, the Project, and the construction of the Entrance Roadway, including any and all judgments therefore, and for all expenses in defending or appealing any such claims or judgments, including without limitation court costs, attorney's fees, and other expenses.
- 7. <u>Supplemental Documents</u>: The Township and County agree to execute any and all additional documents and take any and all reasonable and necessary steps to accomplish the purpose and provisions of this Agreement.
- 8. Non-Discrimination: Pursuant to Indiana Code 22-9-1-10, neither the Township nor the County, nor any of their contractors or subcontractors, shall discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment, to be employed in the performance of any work under this Agreement with respect to hire, tenure, terms or conditions or privileges of employment, or any matter directly or indirectly related to employment because of race, color, religion, sex, disability, national origin, ancestry, or veteran status. Breach of this covenant may be regarded as a material breach of this Agreement.

## 9. Miscellaneous:

- a. <u>Entire Agreement and Amendment.</u> This Agreement constitutes the entire Agreement between the parties and may only be amended by the mutual written consent of the parties.
- b. No Other Agreement. Except as otherwise expressly provided herein, this Agreement supersedes all prior agreements, negotiations, and discussions relative to the subject matter hereof and is a full integration of the agreement of the parties.
- c. <u>Severability</u>. If any provision, covenant, agreement or portion of this Agreement or its application to any person, entity or property is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect the application or validity of any other provisions, covenants, agreements, or portions of this Agreement, and to the end, any provisions, covenants, agreements or portions of this Agreement are declared to be severable.
- d. <u>Indiana Law and Venue</u>. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with laws of the State of Indiana. Any dispute

relating to or arising out of this Agreement shall be brought and maintained exclusively in the Circuit or Superior Courts located in St. Joseph County, Indiana. The parties hereto expressly consent to the sole and exclusive jurisdiction and venue of these courts.

e. <u>Notice</u>. Any notices required or permitted under this Agreement shall be given to the parties at their respective mailing addresses provided below by deposit in the United States mail, certified mail, return receipt requested, with proper postage affixed thereto, and which notices shall be effective three (3) days after date of mailing:

f. <u>Binding Effect</u>: This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties and supersedes all prior discussions, negotiations, understandings, and agreements among them relative to the subject matter of this Agreement and cannot be altered, amended, or terminated without the written agreement of the Parties. This Agreement shall be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of the Parties hereto and their respective successors and assigns; provided,

however, no assignment of this Agreement shall be permitted without the express written consent of the Parties.

g. <u>Counterparts</u>: This Agreement may be executed in several counterparts, each of which shall be an original and all of which shall constitute one and the same agreement.
